We have had good cooperation from our members on dues payments. All have been paid. Thank you.

Our cash assets are held in three accounts at First Bank in Sanford, North Carolina. As of the end of September 2021 the account balances are: Checking account \$ fill ; Money Market \$ fill ; Road Reserve Fund \$ fill for a total of \$ fill .

The largest expenditures this year was to the Carolina Trace Association (CTA). These are Quarterly payments of \$18,188.75 with the last to go out October 1, 2021. There are multiply drainage issues in our POA and Roads and Grounds are addressing them. One large job behind the pool area will be starting soon.

We have set aside \$10,705.00 for our 2021 contribution to the General Reserve and \$45,000.00 for our 2021 contribution to the Road Reserve Fund. These contributions will be added at the end of 2021. Currently our General Reserve has \$48,439.32 and our Road Reserve has \$130,252.25. The contributions to 50/50 so far have totaled \$677.00 which has been spent on pool and recreation supplies.

The board passed, an increase for CTA dues of \$5.00 for improved and unimproved lots. The budget includes dues for 2022 for an improved lot of \$985.00 and for an unimproved lot of \$488.00.

Thank you to everyone for being so prompt in fulfilling our financial responsibilities.

PS: I have been on the board for 4 years and would like to commend our board members for all their hard work, time, and effort that they put into their positions as Volunteers. Because of their work, along with many wonderful volunteers, saves our POA. Take the time and thank the board and the volunteers that make this community what it is, the best in Carolina Trace Country Club. Thank you.

Roads and Grounds has been busy since our last Newsletter. New speed limits signs were placed throughout our POA, reminding us to slow down to 25MPH and lookout out for children playing, people walking pets and walkers and joggers. With help from volunteers, we have cleaned up the ditches, and picked up the brush and limbs on the ditches of the empty lots. This is a ongoing task and a big Thank You to the volunteers that make these tasks possible. There will be some pavement repairs this fall for our worst spots coming up so just be aware of any traffic changes that might need to be done. They will be short term. Also looking for the next group of pavement areas to be done. Working on the Statement of Work so bids can go out for drainage at pool/tennis court entrance and for drainage from behind the pool to the golf course. Fall Clean-up will be October 9, at the pool and branch/limb pick will be week of November 15. With winter coming up, be aware of the weather conditions. We do have a contract for snowplowing, and salting our roads in the POA. For any new residents, we can not do our POA until the CTA does Trace Way. That means you could be snow bound for a day or two. So if that times comes (we do live in the south) it should melt quickly, by have a couple days of milk and bread and grocers on hand.
